

## Belfield

Where: Belfield to Rochdale town centre, Rochdale

Size: 45 hectares

Planned investment: Currently unconfirmed

Partners: Groundwork Oldham and Rochdale, Rochdale Borough Council, The Pennine Edg

Site context: Belfield is a number of brownfield sites, which follow the path of the River Roch fro

Belfield to the town centre of Rochdale. Belfield has had a range of uses in the past including a coalmine, domestic waste tip, bleach works and chemical plant, leaving the site and soil quality poor. In addition, there are also numerous derelict eyesore including four mill lodges, of which only one is currently deemed clean enough for loc fishing clubs to use regularly — a legacy from the site's past as the area's industricheart. Belfield runs close to the Belfield and Clover Hall residential estates within Housing Market Renewal area, and is on the proposed line for the extension to Greate Manchester's tram network. Its proximity to the river means that water regeneration

Future: Newlands will create a network of community woodland, interlinked by a system

pathways to create new, attractive routes into/from the town centre of Rochdal revitalise the lands use and provide screening of the heavily industrial outlook that the site currently has. This project will contribute towards the economic regeneration of the area through supporting the Housing Market Renewal Pathfinder initiative, ar improving views from the proposed line for the extension to Greater Manchester's trainetwork, the Metrolink<sup>1</sup>. Once mature, Belfield will make a dramatic impact on the appearance and perception of the centre of Rochdale and it links, through other gree spaces, with the Kingsway Business Park (a site of regionally strategic importance) attract new investment. Newlands will ensure that the Belfield proposals are develope in ways which not only support the residential an business communities in the area be also a number of other strategic initiatives within the area – for example the Rochdal.
