



Where:	Southport, Lancashire
Size:	21 hectares
Planned investment:	Currently unconfirmed
Partners:	Sefton Borough Council, The Mersey Forest, Groundwork Wirral
Site context:	Disected by one of the main traffic distribution routes of the town, this site is a formal landfill site, overlooked by the Southport Commerce Park, (the borough's largest are of light industry and office space). Town Lane is recognised as an area of particula ecological value, designated a Red Squirrel Refuge site, and feeding and breeding ground for several locally important birds. Town Lane is close to several loc communities and has allotment sites on the boundary.
Future:	The Southport Commerce Park is currently only one third full, and the Newland community woodland proposal is intended to create a green infrastructure that w enhance the park's attractiveness to new business investment. In addition, Seftc Borough Council are proposing to turn the area into an 'active recreation area' – with new public sports facility planned adjoining the site (increasing the critical mass strengthen values and encourage greater investment into the local area). The Newlands design would be developed to support/harmonise with this.
